EDUCATION


We finance and implement quality education projects that drive sustainable development and inequality reduction.

## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

I am proud to share this multiannual report showcasing the inspiring work Give To Colombia began in 2012 to provide access to potable water and sanitation to thousands of beneficiaries in Colombia. These projects are ongoing and continue to provide enduring and sustainable solutions to rural populations. Additionally, they have become models to be replicated by the Colombian Government at a national level.

*“The consequence of lacking potable water is not merely measured by the amount of people that do not have access to it. It is measured by their quality of life, or lack thereof. It is measured by the time and work it takes to access the water.”*

As I quickly learned, the latter (sanitation), cannot exist without the former (water), since the lack of potable water translates immediately into a health threat for a community and its capacity to be productive and thrive. The consequence of lacking potable water is not merely measured by the amount of people that do not have access to it. It is measured by their quality of life, or lack thereof. It is measured by the time and work it takes to access the water. At Give to Colombia, we found solutions for those who for years had to walk at least 3 kilometers per day to gather water.

The lack of potable water also has a direct correlation to school dropout rates. We were faced with girls that at age 14 had to share the same, doorless bathrooms with a 1,000 others! To combat this, we worked with rural public schools to build adequate gender-differentiated stalls and pedagogical models to ensure sustainability. A shortage in potable water results in all types of tropical diseases, which translates to less productivity as the population has to deal with chronic illness. Above all, not having water translates into a life without dignity.

In my toast during our 2015 Colombia Gives Back Gala, I made a tribute to water. I also made a tribute to DIAGEO, a company which for 10 years has supported our efforts. I would now like to quote the same toast from the night of December 8th, 2015:

“I want to propose a toast: a toast to life, with water. I know that is a bit odd for us Latinos who have been taught that one should not toast with water, as it is bad luck. But that is an old superstition that came about when water was mostly dirty and sometimes even deadly... long before our current understanding of the value of clean water and its significance to long-term sustainability. I invite you all to raise a glass of water. Raise your glasses and let's toast and be grateful for the privilege of water, and most importantly for being jointly committed to bringing it to the four million Colombians who deserve better, cleaner, drinkable water.”

I would like to share a story about the granddaughter of Anatolia, a woman I had the fortune to meet in Cañasgordas, the site of one of our chief projects. This young girl had been unable to go to school because she continued to get ill, and as she so colorfully described, “there were fish coming out of the faucet.” Thanks to our project she was able to get better and return to school to pursue her dreams ([view her story here](#)). In 2014, the project was awarded the IDB-FEMSA Silver Drop Award for the most innovative project in water and sanitation for Latin America and the Caribbean.

In our obsession to raise awareness about the value of water, and inspired by the aforementioned prize, we launched an app in 2015: a game for your iPhone or iPad called Water Flow. Engaging and diverting as it was, the app delivered approximately 3,000 installs on iOS and negligible revenue.

Despite its performance, we believe the fundamental concept of the game is compelling and worthy of ongoing improvement. So I am happy to share that we are in the process of developing an HTML5 version of Water Flow, which would be featured inside GameTrove (a subscription-based chat and game application) and distributed through their partnerships with leading mobile operators such as Movistar and Vodacom, MVNOs, travel operators like the Orlando Airport and Spirit Airlines, in-flight entertainment providers and restaurant ordering platforms. The benefit of HTML5 is that it is universally accessible to users of any operating system or platform. As it does not require any app install, users will be able to play the game directly from Give to Colombia's website and partner websites... so stay tuned!

At Give to Colombia we strive to keep innovating and are always ready to support Colombia in whatever way is needed.

## FEATURED PROJECTS

### 2014

#### Water & Sanitation 3,772 kids, 95 families, 206 houses

Give To Colombia was selected in 2012 by the Inter-American Development Bank to carry out a \$2 million pilot project titled “Comprehensive Models of Access to Water & Sanitation in Areas of Extreme Poverty in Colombia.” After that, G2C implemented three scalable and sustainable pilot programs throughout the country. This project earned G2C the IDB-FEMSA Silver Drop Award for the most innovative project in water and sanitation for Latin America and the Caribbean in October of 2014.



### 2015

#### Ciegos & Sordos 200 direct beneficiaries

This donation supported various projects for Instituto para Niños Ciegos y Sordos, providing 100 cataracts surgeries, electrophysiology equipment, living arrangements and transportation for children and their families, the installation of an elevator, wifi in classrooms, the incorporation of learning tablets, and the construction of a classroom.



### 2016

#### Water Flow App

Water Flow is an original and entertaining puzzle game created by Give To Colombia to raise awareness about the importance of potable water & proper sanitation and the obstacles faced by low-income rural communities in Latin America and around the world. Fifty percent of game revenue supported G2C's Water & Sanitation initiatives in Colombia and Latin America, allowing players to 'game for good.'



## FEATURED PROJECTS

### 2017

#### Mocoa 1800 direct beneficiaries

In the aftermath of 2017's tragic landslide in Mocoa, Putumayo, Give To Colombia raised \$423,584 in funds for the construction of an early childhood center with a capacity for 300 children, the construction of housing for 14 families, as well as basic necessities for families in need.



### 2018

#### Creating Community Libraries 6,836 beneficiaries

In partnership with Asociación Alianza Educativa and Corporación Alejandría, this project provided \$300K in funds to transform 5 school libraries located in rural areas near Bogotá, into academic research centers, community hubs, and centers to foster reading.


